"Will you encourage this child to renounce the powers of evil and to receive the freedom of new life in Christ?" (UCC Book of Worship page 137

"Do you renounce the powers of evil and desire the freedom of new life in Christ?" (UCC Book of Worship page 149)

I have been watching news reports ever since Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022. The images of destruction are terrifying. Homes, apartment complexes, schools, churches, stores, and government buildings uninhabitable. Personal items flapping in the breeze. The worst images are of children's toys left behind and visible in the rubble. The images of people fleeing and the stories we are hearing from those who have reached safety. Children traveling alone. I shared in worship an image of a mother and child I can't get out of my head, sitting on the ground, cradling one another. Another image that haunts me is of several strollers and car seats set up in public square, a memorial with each stroller and car seat representing a child who has lost their life. It breaks my heart. This is all so horrifying and as I see it played out, I want to turn off my TV. And while I can do that, erase it from my vision for a while, those living it cannot.

Rev. Dr. Lisa Cressman, an Episcopal priest and steward of Backstory Preaching, an on-line group I am a part of, wrote an article about our response as people of faith to the evil we see in this situation and in others around us. She goes back to our baptism vows. At the top of this page are the vows parents make at baptism and the vow made at Confirmation. As people baptized into the faith of Jesus Christ, we are called to renounce evil. I am guessing that we all can agree what is happening in Ukraine is evil. So, how can we renounce it? What does that look like?

We can pray for peace. Pray for wisdom of all governmental representatives. Pray they have the courage to act justly. Pray for those who are suffering. When we pray for peace, we don't forget those who have none. It moves us from complacency towards creative acts of peace-making. Also, pray for those who are destroying God's beloved. Pray for a change of heart. Pray for those in Russia who are powerless to change the course their leaders have taken and are suffering too. Pray for peace.

There are many ways to put these prayers into action as well. Relief agencies are at work all over Ukraine and the counties in which refugees, DeForest, WI 53532. Write "Ukraine" in the memo line. 100% of monies donated through the UCC appeal will be sent to Ukrainian relief efforts have sought safety. The financial burden is overwhelming. Support those seeking to help with your financial contribution. You may have an agency that you prefer to support, and I encourage you to do so. The WI Conference UCC has also set up an emergency relief fund. Gifts to the UCC Ukraine Emergency Appeal will provide shelter, food and other essentials to refugees and internally displaced people. Another question we all answered at our Confirmation is, "Do you promise, by the grace of God, to be Christ's disciple, to follow in the way of our Savior, to resist oppression and evil, to show love and justice, and to witness to the work and word of Jesus Christ as best you are able?" Our response, "I promise, with the help of God." We see these images as well, of people resisting, of people offering assistance, of strollers being left at train stations so mothers who have been carrying their children can use them. May we fulfill this promise by praying for and supporting those who are on the ground in and near Ukraine. As Rev. Dr. Cressman says in her article, "when we are silent, we infer that things are OK as they are." And we all know they are not.

Treasurer's Update

As of February 28, 2022

First and foremost, the Consistory would like to thank you for your generosity. Without your financial support the mission and ministry of Saron UCC would not be possible. The Consistory would also like to keep you, the congregation, updated on the financial situation at Saron.

The <u>General Fund</u> supports the work of the church through salaries, programs, building upkeep, office expenses, utilities, supplies, and of course insurances (the items that are included in our line-item budget).

YTD income \$24,235 YTD expenses \$31,094

Saron currently has a surplus in our General Fund of \$87,904. This will be used to offset any difference between our income and expenses during the year.

The **<u>Benevolence Fund</u>** supports our OCWM commitment, our SPARE student, other mission opportunities and acts as a pass-through account for the UCC Special Mission Offerings.

YTD income \$2,990

Of this total income amount, \$2,200 has been designated to OCWM which is 11% of our annual budgeted commitment for OCWM of \$20,500. Gifts for the Souper Bowl of Caring totaled \$364, and this amount was sent to the Sheboygan County Food Bank.

The funds received for OCWM are distributed quarterly. The funds received later in the year for OGHS, STC, and NIN are distributed in the month after they are received. Gifts received toward SPARE sponsorship total \$350 and will be paid out by the end of the year.

The **Improvement Fund** supports all maintenance of the buildings and property that is not covered under General Fund expenses.

Current amount in the fund is \$83,991. Of this amount, \$34,530 has been designated to be applied to the septic system replacement costs. Monies in this fund can be carried over from year to year.

Septic System Project Update As Of February 28, 2022

As you will recall, in May 2020 we provided the congregation with a copy of the accepted bids from Schwartz Septic, Neumann Plumbing & Heating and KW Electric for replacement of the septic system. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$44,406 (which includes an additional \$5,000 above bids for unforeseen expenses). Here is an update to the congregation on the progress that has been made in funding this project.

Balance needed for septic system project	\$ 5,876.00

Barring any unforeseen expenses that may arise, we expect to be able to pay the balance of the septic project out of the Improvement Fund balance when the final total comes due later in 2022. Therefore, we do not anticipate the need to explore further fundraising options.
