"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humble with your God?" (Micah 6:8)

I have thought often of this passage over the last few weeks. As the number of protests over things people strongly believe in have increased or at least it seems that way. As posts on social media in particular declare an either/or position on almost anything. As acts of compassion and kindness, of people looking out for one another don't seem as prevalent as they did at the beginning of this pandemic. I find myself reflecting on this passage from the prophet Micah.

It helps to read all of chapter 6 in Micah (or the entire book for that matter). As prophets almost always do, Micah starts out with judgment then moves to hope. He points out all that God has done for the people throughout their history (6:3-5) and then moves to what is expected of the people in return (6:6-8). Of course, the people want what is easy – burnt offering, livestock, oil, their first born. But through the prophet, God says, "I don't want any of those things. What I want is for you to 'do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God." It isn't our piety, our sacrifices or the way we perform or participate in worship, it is how we live our everyday lives.

Things are pretty chaotic right now. But as the people of God we are called to work for fairness and equality for all people, especially the weak and powerless who are easily exploited by others, to reach out in love and compassion, and to remember we walk with God, putting God first in our lives.

I am sharing this quote from Steven Charleston, Native American elder and retired Episcopal bishop of Alaska, with you as I think it summarized Micah 6:8 very well. Use it to reflect on your own life of faith.

"Now is the moment for which a lifetime of faith has prepared you. All of those years of prayer and study, all of the worship services, all of the time devoted to a community of faith: it all comes down to this, this sorrowful moment when life seems chaotic and the anarchy of fear haunts the thin borders of reason. Your faith has prepared you for this. It has given you the tools you need to respond: to proclaim justice while standing for peace. Long ago the Spirit called you to commit your life to faith. Now you know why. You are a source of strength for those who have lost hope. You are a voice of calm in the midst of chaos. You are a steady light in days of darkness. The time has come to be what you believe."
