The 34th General Synod was held in Indianapolis, IN June 30 – July 4. The theme was Making All Things New. Every two years, General Synod brings together thousands of faithful members of the United Church of Christ for inspirational worship, conducting the business of the church, formal church witness, and fellowship with friends (old and new). The delegates from

Wisconsin shared some highlights from General Synod.

History was made at this year's General Synod as Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson was elected as the 10th General Minister and President of the UCC. Although she is the 3rd woman nominated for this position, she is the 1st elected. Rev. Dr. Thompson served previously as the Associate General Minister for Wider Church Ministries and Co-Executive for Global Ministries. Farewell was bid to Rev. John Dorhauer who served eight years as General Minister and President.

The UCC by-laws were changed regarding the frequency of General Synod. The next General Synod will be in Kansas City in 2025 and there after will be every three years instead of every two years. Those in favor of this change sited cost savings and the ability to hold virtual meetings. Those against fear a loss of connection to the wider church.

The keynote speaker was Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber, author, public theologian, Lutheran pastor. She spoke about being "a part of an old, old story that starts at the beginning of time, brushes the skin of the present, and reaches into the promised future." "God is not done," she declared.

Many of us have learned through Confirmation that the UCC was made up of four denominations that formed two and then one – the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Christian Churches. But there was a 5th stream that has been overlooked when we recall our roots – the Afro-Christian Convention. Apologies were made and initiatives begun to correct the history of our denomination.

Much more happened at General Synod. You can check out the UCC Website (ucc.org/generalsynod) to find out more about these highlights and all the other businesses and activities that took place.

I feel fortunate to have been a delegate twice for General Synod and a volunteer when the Wisconsin Conference hosted it in Milwaukee. It makes me realize how we are part of something bigger than ourselves and the difference we can make in the world when we work together. We may not agree on all the actions taken at General Synod or by the wider church, but that is the beauty of the UCC. We don't have to, and we can still be in covenant with one another.

Immanuel UCC Food Pantry– We encourage Saron members to continue to support this food pantry. We will have a drive of suggested items to donate bimonthly.

Habitat for Humanity– Habitat for Humanity will again sponsor the Rock The Block Neighborhood Revitalization Program for the Sheridan Park neighborhood in Sheboygan. This year's dates are September 21-23.

Sheboygan Community Cafe— Saron members will have the opportunity beginning in October to prepare and serve a lunch for the Community Cafe. The Community Cafe offers a light lunch each day, except Sundays, to anyone who wishes to come. It is held at St. Luke UMC in Sheboygan.

Feed My Starving Children–Following the success of last year's work, Saron members will again have the opportunity to assist in mixing ingredients for ready-made meals that are delivered world-wide where there is great need. The dates are October 6 or 7.

Salvation Army– The confirmation students will be making Christmas cookies for the inmates at Kettle Moraine Correctional Center, and other Saron members will be welcome to help.

Sheboygan Warming Shelter– Saron members will have several opportunities to prepare and/or serve a warm meal to homeless individuals during the winter months.

Mary's Room–Based on the great response last year, we will again sponsor a 'baby shower' for Mary's Room to be held on Mother's Day (May 12, 2024). Mary's Room, located in Sheboygan, is a resource for needy mothers and their infants. We will be seeking donations of clothing, toys, and diapers.

Bridge Builders in Milwaukee— Saron members of all ages will have the opportunity to participate in a one-day (Saturday) mission project to help restore homes in the city of Milwaukee. We are hoping to secure a Saturday date in May.

Treasurer's Update As of June 30, 2023

First and foremost, the Consistory would like to thank you for your generosity. Without your financial support the mission and ministry of Saron UCC would not be possible. The Consistory would also like to keep you, the congregation, updated on the financial situation at Saron.

The <u>General Fund</u> supports the work of the church through salaries, programs, building upkeep, office expenses, utilities, supplies, and of course insurance (the items that are included in our line-item budget).

YTD income \$77,530

YTD expenses \$96,800

YTD Deficit \$19,270

For the month of June, there was a net deficit of \$9,850 which increased the year-to-date deficit in our general fund. Although there is a reserve built up in the general fund, \$9,850 of that reserve was used for expenses. Please prayerfully consider your support of the daily and weekly vital functions of Saron Church as we go forward through the year.

The <u>Improvement Fund</u> supports all maintenance of the buildings and property that is not covered under General Fund expenses. Monies in this fund can be carried over from year to year.

YTD Income \$8.800

YTD expenditures \$7,680 (includes final septic bills)

Total Available Fund Balance \$41,870

The major improvement projects of the new roof and the septic system have been paid in full. Thanks to the generosity of all of you, these costly projects were completed without depleting the Improvement Fund. There are no improvement projects scheduled, so the balance in the fund should cover any emergency issues that might come up.

The **Benevolence Fund** supports our OCWM commitment, our SPARE student, other mission opportunities and acts as a pass-through account for the UCC Special Mission Offerings.

OCWM (\$20,500 commitment - \$10,643 designated, = 52% of commitment)
