"O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see the lie! Above the deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by;

Yet in the dark streets shineth the everlasting Light; The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight."

I thought of these words often as I walked through the streets of Bethlehem. Bethlehem isn't very little, not even in the old part of the city. We picture in our minds a quaint little town with farms and rolling hills. But that isn't Bethlehem. There are very few empty spaces and they have had to build up as there is no space to build out.

The city isn't very still either. Every morning we were woken up by the call to prayer, a signal to those who are followers of Islam that it was time for prayers. The call to prayer is broadcast over loudspeakers from the nearest mosque. The market areas open early and there are always people shopping and walking around. Roads are narrow and cars are always honking to make sure there are no accidents. Bethlehem never seems to be still.

Tourists and pilgrims flock to the city to visit The Church of the Nativity. The Church of the Nativity is one of the oldest surviving Christian churches and is believed to be built over the spot where Jesus was born. The first church was built in 326 by Constantine and his mother St. Helena. This church was destroyed in 530 and the current church was built in its place. It has survived much over the ensuing centuries. The Greek Orthodox, Roman Catholic, and Armenian Orthodox churches share the building and attend to different parts of it. Parts of the church are very ornate and others very simple.

Crowds gather early and get in a line that never seems to end to go down into the grotto where the birthplace of Jesus is located. Guides were speaking in all different languages explaining the features of the church to those in their group, while the priests kept trying to maintain quiet and a sense of reverence. It didn't work very well! No stillness here either. But once you got to the stairs going down into the grotto, once the crowd funneled into the small space, the stillness hit me. Not that it was devoid of noise, but a stillness that comes in the midst of noise. There is a star on the floor where it is believed the exact birthplace was. There used to be a silver star there, but it was stolen in 1847. Now there is only the outline of it. Some people knelt down. Some leaned in to touch or kiss the stone. There was crying and praying. To be truthful it was rather overwhelming for me.

I think what struck me in that moment and what I have continued to think about is the last line of the carol - "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight." It wasn't just that holy night, but every night since then. Every time someone visits the grotto. Every time we share the Christmas story. We hand over our fears to Jesus and place our hope in him that things can and will be different. That is what keeps us going when our world doesn't seem to be much different than it was at the time of Jesus' birth.

I don't know that I will ever sing O Little Town of Bethlehem in quite the same way as before our trip, but sing it I will!


Cookie Sale
