I can't quite fathom that this is the last Advent I will be planning worship for. It is one of the most fun seasons to prepare. Unlike Lent which can be so somber, Advent is filled with joy and wonder. There can be so many moving parts to the services and I am so appreciative of those who are willing to be a part of it. I also look forward to how the Worship Enhancement Team transforms the sanctuary. It is truly a special time, and I can hardly wait.

A few years ago, I read an Advent devotion entitled *The Challenge of Waiting* by Martin Copenhaver, a UCC pastor and former president of Andover Newton Seminary. In it he said, "Advent is a season devoted to waiting. It is a time when we celebrate waiting, honor those who waited for the coming of the Messiah and seek to learn something about how we might join them in waiting for the Spirit of Christ to be born again in our midst." In a world of instant gratification, waiting can be so hard. Some waiting is irritating – at a doctor's office, in traffic, for a repair person to arrive. Some waiting fills us with excitement and anticipation – a package to arrive, a baby to be born, a birthday celebration, a celebration of any kind. This year, waiting has been more on my mind than other years. After my retirement, this congregation will be in a state of waiting. Waiting for a new pastor to be called. Hopefully, an interim will be found to help lead you through this process, but it will still be a time of waiting. What will that waiting be like? Will it be one of irritation and frustration or one of excitement and anticipation? You get to decide that. My prayer is that you work through the process and find the gifts at each phase. Don't rush to a final decision but enjoy the journey. Copenhaver continues, "To wait is to be open to the future. To wait is to be open to God."

As we journey together through this Advent season, may the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love go with us into the future. Copenhaver's prayer at the end of the devotion is fitting. "God, you know that we can find it challenging to wait. So, teach our hearts to wait. Or, to put it another way, please give us the gift of hope. Amen."

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Worship Services


With Advent beginning on December 3rd this year, the fourth Sunday of Advent falls on December 24!

Proposal #1 for annual meeting January 21st 2024

Dear Saron UCC Congregation

We are writing to seek approval for a project that is essential for maintaining the integrity and safety of Saron's premises. We propose to invest up to \$25,000 in sealing the parking lot and church. This project is crucial to extend the lifespan of the parking lot, improve its appearance, and ensure the safety of our employees, and visitors.

**Project Scope: **

The project will include the following key elements:

Project scope limited to church property parking lots and drives. (Proposal excludes cemetery property, cemetery maintenance will be conducted and paid for with cemetery funds).

1. **Surface Preparation: ** Thorough cleaning and preparation of the parking lot surface to remove debris, dirt, and loose materials. This step is vital to ensure proper adhesion of the sealant.

- 2. **Crack Filling: ** Filling and repairing any cracks in the pavement to prevent water infiltration, which can lead to further damage.
- 3. **Sealcoating: ** Application of a high-quality sealant to protect the asphalt surface from UV rays, water damage, and general wear and tear. Sealcoating will also enhance the overall appearance of the parking lot.
- 4. **Line Striping: ** Re-striping the parking lot for clear and organized traffic flow, parking space delineation, and ADA compliance. Fresh paint will improve visibility and safety for all users.

**Benefits: **

- 1. **Prolonged Lifespan: ** Sealing the parking lot will significantly extend its lifespan, reducing the need for costly repairs and resurfacing in the future.
- 2. **Enhanced Appearance: ** A freshly sealed parking lot not only looks better but also creates a positive impression for customers and visitors.
- 3. **Safety: ** A well-maintained parking lot with clear line striping enhances safety by reducing the risk of accidents and ensuring accessibility for all, including those with disabilities.
- 4. **Cost Savings: ** Proactive maintenance is more cost-effective than reactive repairs. Investing now can save us money in the long run.

**Budget: **

The estimated cost for this project is \$20,000, which includes all materials, labor, and equipment needed for the job. We have obtained competitive quotes from reputable contractors in the area.

**Timeline: **

We propose to initiate this project at the earliest convenient date after approval and complete it within a reasonable time frame to minimize disruption to our daily operations.

**Funding Source: **

Proposal #2 for annual meeting January 21st 2024

Dear Saron UCC Congregation

The cemetery board is proposing the installation of a new sign on our west cemetery, currently there is no sign designation in the west cemetery.

Purpose of the project:

To install a new cemetery sign that is visually appealing and durable.

Enhance the overall appearance of the entrance, creating a more inviting atmosphere for visitors.

Design and Features:

Similar in design to the south cemetery sign using polished mahogany granite tablet and base.

Grey granite side marker would be etched with an image of Saron UCC.

Poured on site concrete foundation.

Estimated cost:

The estimated cost for the sign project is \$22,500, inclusive of design, materials, labor and installation.

Funding source:

With consistory approval we propose to allocate funds for this project from the Memorial Fund, which has been set aside for improvements that honor and respect the memory of those laid to rest in our cemetery.

Cemetery funds cannot be used for this project in accordance with our financial guidelines.

Benefits:

Improved aesthetics that contribute to a dignified and respectful environment.

Enhanced visibility and ease of navigation for visitors

Project timeline:

Pending approval, the project is expected to be completed in the summer of 2024

Next Steps.

Upon approval, we will initiate the design and fabrication process, coordinating with reputable vendors to ensure the highest quality.

Conclusion:

The cemetery board with the full support of the consistory believe that investing in a new cemetery sign is a meaningful way to honor the memory of those we've lost and to provide a more comforting experience for their loved ones. We appreciate your consideration of this proposal.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. We look forward to the opportunity to enhance our cemetery's entrance and provide a lasting tribute to those we serve.

Treasurer's Update

As of October 31, 2023

First and foremost, the Consistory would like to thank you for your generosity. Without your financial support the mission and ministry of Saron UCC would not be possible. The Consistory would also like to keep you, the congregation, updated on the financial situation at Saron.

The <u>General Fund</u> supports the work of the church through salaries, programs, building upkeep, office expenses, utilities, supplies, and of course insurance (the items that are included in our line-item budget).

YTD income \$140,520

YTD expenses \$154,740

YTD Deficit \$14,220

For the month of October, there was a net income of \$11,620 which helped to reduce the year-to-date deficit in our general fund to the amount shown above. Please prayerfully consider your support of the daily and weekly vital functions of Saron Church as we approach the end of the year so that we can erase the deficit entirely.

The <u>Improvement Fund</u> supports all maintenance of the buildings and property that is not covered under General Fund expenses. Monies in this fund can be carried over from year to year.

YTD income \$15,200

YTD expenditures

\$7,700 (includes final septic bills)

Total Available Fund Balance \$48.250

The major improvement projects of the new roof and the septic system have been paid in full. Thanks to the generosity of all of you, these costly projects were completed without depleting the improvement fund. There are no improvement projects scheduled, so the balance in the fund should cover any emergency issues that might come up.

The **Benevolence Fund** supports our OCWM commitment, our SPARE student, other mission opportunities and acts as a pass-through account for the UCC Special Mission Offerings.

YTD income \$19,812

OCWM (\$20,500 commitment - \$16,687 designated, = 81% of commitment)
