#### Sunshine, sand, and sea water always revive my spirit and my soul.

I know it is a little crazy going on a vacation during a pandemic, but the precautions that were taken at the resort were remarkable. Social distancing was easy to maintain as a hotel that could accommodate around 700 people had less than 100 guests. All staff were masked, and guests were required to wear masks in the dining rooms and buffet lines. Hand sanitizer was available all over and temperature checks were done at check-in. We were able to maintain a bubble that isn't always easy to do here at home. I am grateful that I had the opportunity for renewal and relaxation.

One day as I was standing in the Caribbean Sea, the waves came crashing in. Even though I was not in deep water, I was nearly knocked off my feet. The sand under my feet shifted and keeping my footing became challenging. I moved to what I thought was firmer ground, but the waves kept coming and they were pretty strong. I found that the harder I tried to hold my ground, the more unstable I became. Standing firm only made it more difficult to stay on my feet. I found that if I shifted my weight with the wave and kind of flowed with it, I was able to stay on my feet and move farther out in the water.

The Church (notice the capital C) is in a transitional place right now. The world, like the sand under my feet, is changing. A pandemic like a wave has caused us to lose our footing. Those rituals and activities that gave us identity are no longer possible to participate in right now. We are finding that what we find meaningful, isn't meaningful or important for everyone. We have some choices to make. Do we try and stand firm, hoping we don't get knocked over? Or do we figure out ways to keep upright by moving with the changes?

Out of necessity we have implemented many changes to our worship. Some of these changes we hope are temporary, but others have launched whole new ministries. Facebook kept us connected early on in the pandemic. It was space for us to gather in and share our collective anxiety. How can we use it in the future? Live-streaming worship has allowed participation by many who are unable to worship in person. While it doesn't take the place of worshipping together as a community, it provides an opportunity for folks who cannot participate on Sunday mornings (not an ideal time of everyone). We have invested in better equipment and are looking at other ways to enhance this ministry. Are there ways this technology can be used in other ways? Sunday School? Faith Formation studies? Again, it doesn't take the place of gathering in person. There is nothing like seeing someone face to face and reaching out to touch their hand (when it is safe to do so), but the opportunities for reaching people outside our four walls are endless. While technology is a wonderful tool, we cannot rely solely on it. How can we bring worship and faith formation to those who do not have access to technology? Can we think outside the box of what has been to what can be as we heed God's call?

As I stood in those waves, I found myself purposely walking into them. As I looked out on endless sea, I couldn't help but think of all the possibilities that God has placed before us. It is very exciting! I hope you are as excited as I am about what the future holds.


