*"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35* 

# Members and Friends of Saron United Church of Christ,

Jesus spoke these words to the disciples at the Last Supper. It is a reminder to us that the church is called to be a community of people who care about and for one another. While we know people are eager to return to worshiping in the sanctuary, the Consistory has taken this commandment to love one another into consideration as decisions were made about returning to in-person worship.

After reviewing guidelines from the Wisconsin Council of Churches, Sheboygan County Public Health, Badger Bounce Back and conversations with health care professionals and congregation members, the following timeline and preventative measures were agreed upon.

Unless the Sheboygan County Benchmarks (which are updated weekly) indicate not to, we will resume in person worship on **June 21, 2020**. We will hold one service at 9:30 am as would be our normal schedule for the summer months.

Since a vaccine is not yet available physical distancing will be necessary to prevent the spread of the virus as much as possible. Therefore, every other pew will be blocked off. Those who are not a part of the same family may sit in the same pew as long as a distance of 6 feet is maintain (example: a couple on each end of the pew). The balcony will be open to aid in separation. The front pews will be seated first, and dismissal will be from the back of the sanctuary to the front. This will reduce the risk of a bottleneck at the entrance. The pastor will not shake hands as people depart and we encourage you to not congregate in the narthex, but to socialize in the parking lot at a safe distance. We may need to limit the number of people worshiping in the sanctuary if we reach physical distancing capacity.

There is so much debate over the use of masks. Wearing a mask is an act of love for our neighbor, those who are more vulnerable to the virus. Masks will be required for worship, unless there is a medical reason you are unable to wear one. You may bring your own if you have one and cloth masks will be available at church for you to use for worship and then take home to wash and reuse.

Hand sanitizing stations will be available in the narthex.

Restrooms will be open. And although it does not really need to be said - wash your hands. We ask that you use a paper towel to open the door and dispose of it in the wastebasket that will be located by the bubbler.

One of the reasons communal worship spreads the virus more than other activities is how we worship. Our worship service will look different for the foreseeable future.

- Offering plates will be located at the entrance to the sanctuary and will not be passed during the service. An usher will bring the plates up during the offertory and place them on the altar.
- We will continue to have a Children's Sermon but will not have the children come forward.
- We will have all the information necessary for worship on the screen and will not pass out bulletins.
- Singing has been shown to spread the virus faster as the droplets are broken up and become aerosols which hang in the air much longer. So, while it is very difficult to imagine, there will be no congregational singing. We will find other ways to enjoy music together.
- Communion is another risky practice. We have purchased individual communion cups (they
  have grape juice in the cup and a wafer on top and are sealed). A gloved Consistory member
  will place one of these cups in your hand if you chose to participate in communion. We will then
  consume the wafer and the grape juice at the same time. Unfortunately, we will be suspending
  the children coming forward during the final hymn for bread and a blessing.
- The nursery will not be staffed during the summer months, but sanitizer will be available if a family chooses to take a little one down and care for them themselves.

We love you and seeing you in worship, but if you are feeling sick or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 (Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fever, Chills, Muscle pain, Sore throat, New loss of taste or smell) or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive, please remain at home. Worship services will continue to be available online.

As the situation changes, these practices will be reviewed and revised as needed. I am sure you have seen the stories of places of worship being closed again due to the spread of COVID-19 amongst their congregation. We do not want that to happen here. Updates will be shared via the Thursday Greetings and telephone calls where appropriate.

The Consistory and Pastor are available for any questions or concerns you may wish to share.


Sign-up sheets are posted on the kiosk for help that is needed during the summer months at Saron:
