So, what if we stopped climbing and started fertilizing, watering, and blooming right where we find ourselves?"

I will be using Marcia's *Good Enough: Embracing the Imperfections of Life and Faith* series for worship on Sunday's and for our midweek Lenten program. This series is based on Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie's book *Good Enough: 40ish Devotionals For a Life of Imperfection.* I just received my book and haven't had the chance to delve into it yet, but I can't wait. I am hoping that on the Wednesday nights we will engage in discussions and sharing our own life experiences related to the questions posed in the guides that accompany the series and the book. Lent has historically been the time for not only learning about the faith, but also reflecting on our lives of faith. These discussions will give us a chance to do just that.

As Marcia concludes in her overview, "Welcome to a Lent of affirming a faith in which we are blessed, *regardless*, and where we can lean into embracing our "good enough" lives."

Pastor's Report:

Pastor RaeAnn addressed the congregation and thanked them, along with the consistory members for coming together during this difficult year. There were new challenges this past year and we were able to adapt and overcome everything that came our way.

Ballots Collected:

All the ballots were distributed and the 5 ballot counters were as follows: Amanda Boedecker, Makayla VanHelden, Carl Laack, Jacob Barthels, and Heather Zimbal.

President's Report:

President Nathan Dassow addressed the congregation and thanked Pastor RaeAnn as well as the rest of the consistory. Nathan then listed off some of the highlights from the past year.

- Brought back singing during worship, bulletins, hymnals, and Bibles.
- Communion is distributed to congregation using regular bread and wine in the pews.
- Single repair to narthex roof.
- Deep carpet cleaning of Sunday School rooms.
- Made a new trustee list for the trustees.
- The custodian, Connie, retired and Pete Christy was hired.
- Worked on making opportunities for fellowship time within the church again.
- Fall cleanup was completed.
- Consistory set goals for Pastor RaeAnn.
- Strategic Planning goals were set up by the consistory.
- New sand added to volleyball courts.
- Permits were obtained for the new septic system.

Review of Treasurer's Report:

Tracy explained why consistory decided not to give a 6% raise to church employees.

Consistory will pay half of Pastor RaeAnn's health insurance since she had to get her own insurance due to Rory retiring.

Endowment committee was given money to make a plaque in the narthex.

An extra \$4,000 was added to the budget as the books must be audited this year.

Pastor RaeAnn made some comments about the OCWM because a few things were brought up at the budget meeting.

Septic System:

Lee Post asked if the cost of the project was going to increase in price. Nathan responded "we are still going off the price of the bid and the price will not increase."

Other Business:

Judy Knuth inquired about going back to one church service with the idea that singing would be louder and church fellowship would increase each Sunday. Nathan responded that that we will continue with 2 services currently due to Sunday School already having a set schedule for this year.

Allen Nohl asked about putting a metal roof on the narthex. Nathan reported that the consistory will be further investigating that. Jerry Henning asked how long the shingles have been on the roof. Nathan responded that they are the original shingles from 1998.

Lee Post asked about having a fund raiser to help pay for some of these projects. Nathan replied that we are having a cornhole tournament in April. Barb Post talked about the mission trip fundraiser which is a Soup Cook-off sometime in February or March.
