Food for thought: From UCC April 20th Daily Devotonal

"God, your God, is immense and powerful and awesome. God doesn't play favorites, takes no bribes, makes sure orphans and widows are treated fairly, takes loving care of <u>foreigners</u> by seeing that they get food and clothing." - Deuteronomy 10:17-18 (MSG)

Announcement From The Endowment Committee

The Endowment Fund Committee is excited to announce that we have received and reviewed three applications for distribution of Endowment Funds. We approved one for funding of Saron's Mission Team's work with Milwaukee Bridge Builders Ministry. It was determined that the two other requests for funds were supported within the church budget,

Giving To Saron United Church of Christ Using Qualified Charitable Distributions

Do you have a traditional Individual Retirement Account (IRA)?

Are you age 70-1/2 or older?

If you answered "yes" to both of these questions, then the IRS and the Wisconsin Department of Revenue give you the opportunity to transfer gifts of almost any amount to the charity of your choice (such as Saron United Church of Christ) tax-free each year using what is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (withdrawal) or "QCD".

Normally, withdrawals from a traditional IRA are taxed in the year that you receive them.

When you make a QCD withdrawal from your traditional IRA, the funds that are given to the charity are <u>not</u> taxed to you. An important point to note is that the funds must be made payable directly to the charity – not to you.

Another benefit is that if you are age 73 or older and are subject to Required Minimum Distributions, the QCD also qualifies for satisfying the RMD requirement.

Does the idea of a QCD sound like something that you would like to do as an easy way to support Saron UCC? Then here are the steps you can take to get started:

Contact your financial advisor or tax preparer and ask them to help you set up a QCD, and verify that a QCD will work for your particular situation.

Decide on the amount of the gift you would like to make.

Verify if your IRA provider will allow you to make QCDs in any amount, and allow for withdrawals with frequencies of monthly, quarterly, or annually as you wish.

- Be sure to specify that the QCD be made payable directly to Saron United Church of Christ.
- Be sure that your IRA provider includes your name on the payment stub so that when it arrives at Saron you are given credit on your giving statement.

When you prepare your tax return at the end of the year, be sure to remember that you had a QCD so that you can record it properly and exclude it from your taxable income.

Treasurer's Update As of March 31, 2024

First and foremost, the Consistory would like to thank you for your generosity. Without your financial support the mission and ministry of Saron UCC would not be possible. The Consistory would also like to keep you, the congregation, updated on the financial situation at Saron.

The <u>General Fund</u> supports the work of the church through salaries, programs, building upkeep, office expenses, utilities, supplies, and insurance (the items that are included in our line-item budg-et).

YTD income \$47,610 YTD expenses \$49,670

YTD Deficit \$2,060

Please prayerfully consider your support of the daily and weekly vital functions of Saron Church as we go through the year.

The **Improvement Fund** supports all maintenance of the buildings and property that is not covered under General Fund expenses. Monies in this fund can be carried over from year to year.

YTD income \$9,080 YTD expenditures \$16

Total Available Fund Balance \$61,940

The parking lot maintenance project has a budgeted amount of \$25,000 which will be paid through the Improvement Fund. Quoting for this project is currently in progress.

The **<u>Benevolence Fund</u>** supports our OCWM commitment and other mission opportunities, and acts as a pass-through account for the UCC Special Mission Offerings.

YTD income \$4,650

Designated Disbursements:

OCWM (\$20,500 commitment; \$2,913 designated, = 14% of commitment)

OGHS (\$1,412 received, to be paid out in April)

Souper Bowl of Caring (\$142 received, and sent to the Sheboygan Food Bank)

Other pass-throughs for special mission offerings and projects are distributed as they are collected throughout the year.
