Dear Ones,

Bundled together like shocks of wheat or rye from times past, are the days of November. Daylight saving time ends. A national election takes place. A new president will be set forward to preside over the affairs of the nation. We will commemorate the end of a war that was said to end all wars on the eleventh day of the eleventh month at the eleventh hour. We will celebrate the Day of Thanksgiving, and we will usher in the Advent Season on the last Sunday of the month.

In the meantime, life goes on. Apprehensions about what will occur after the election is an exaggeration of the apprehensions we face on a daily basis. These apprehensions have to do with health, with anxiety about or kids or grandkids. They have to do with money or more often, the lack of it. We have apprehensions. So, what are we about to do about them?

We can't simply raise up our hands and declare it's too, much to get our heads around and turn aside. We have to do what we can do to ease the apprehensions we have. At the least, we have to be there for one another. So, our candidate loses does that mean we 'll do everything in our power to obstruct his/her leadership? Do we walk away from a youngster that makes the wrong choice at a particular point in his/her life? Do we abandon the sick? Do we become miserly when sharing is called for?

It is enough of a burden to live out our lives unable to do anything in certain situations save to offer our prayers. The rub comes when we add to chaotic situations. When we refuse to offer help where help is needed. It comes when we refuse to open our minds to rational thought and run head-long into senseless rage against whatever we perceive to be an absolute truth, 'cause there ain't no such animule. ("You could look it up!")

I love that passage from Isaiah; "Come", says the Lord. "Let us reason together... If you are willing, you shall eat the good of the land. But if you refuse, you will be swallowed up by that which will do you in"

And lastly, there is in November the beginning of Advent. The time of the coming of the Lord. It is the time of hope, of caring, of wonder. It is the time of Emmanuel, of "God with us". Let us in our times of apprehensions declare of ourselves that in so far as possible, I seek to walk with God.


# A Message From Saron's Search Committee
