#### FROM THE PASTOR:

There are instances when a minister reflects upon a sermon he has delivered and realizes that it was incomplete, or too ethereal, or that it plainly did not make sense. The sermon entitled "Reaping What's Left" falls into the category for me, of being incomplete. The things I neglected to reflect upon, urge me to complete what I expressed in that sermon.

I neglected to include the on-going process all of us have in common when we consider a look back to former times. What we remember as a full harvest includes not only the bounty of the fields, or the success of our work, or the fulfillment of our dreams. Intricately bound up in whatever our harvest is by us named, we include the ones who mean all the world to us. Our family, including Martha who talks too much, and Uncle Josh who drinks too much. Our family brings color, imagination, love, beauty, and the myriad and one other things to the joy of a harvest we remember.

As we grow older we become aware that one harvest can be measurably different from another not only by way of the quantity we are able to garner or gather as the case may be. It is measurably different by way of those who seat themselves about our tables. People move on, children grow up, irreparable damage takes place when friendship is betrayed or a spouse leaves home. We as a people contend with such things and it is an incomplete expression of loss that refers to such events as "over and done with". We yet bear the remembrances of the abundant harvests of the past. We remember the people. We remember our grandparents. In some instances, we remember our mothers, our fathers, our children... The ones who still and ever are part of our lives. They do not disappear. On the contrary, they reappear in every harvest we celebrate, and as in Thanksgiving when we address to God our prayers of gratitude, we pray our thanks for those who yet bless us with their presence.

In this process of "Reaping What's Left", we gather the essence of those lives who provided us with so much joy, so much wisdom, so much love... You name what is remembered of those you cherish, and remember to include those who even though they are no longer part of the family circle, or the embrace of true friendship. Because at one time, they too, blest our day.

So, as we reap what's left in this season of Thanksgiving from all the previous harvests we have celebrated, let us with reverence give thanks for a merciful God who perfects the imperfections of all his children and so blesses us no matter where we reside.

Along the wayside, we gather what's left of the abundant harvest and pause to preserve within our hearts not only what we celebrate in present time, but what was, once upon a time.

There. I think that completes what I neglected to say on the subject, "Reaping What's Left." I could add some other thoughts but for the present, it concludes what I intended to preach a few Sundays ago.

To you all, I express my fondest wish that you and yours will have a very Happy Thanksgiving.






#### **SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS**
