"Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift is from above."

(James 1:17)

In the Fall of the year, many congregations participate in a Stewardship campaign where they talk about the mission and ministry that the church participates in and then ask the congregation to pledge (or commit) a percentage of their financial resources to the mission and ministry of the church. Many find that prayerfully considering their giving and filling out the card helps them focus not so much on the amount, but on the reason they give to the church. Which in turn affects the amount they give.

The passages above are a couple that have been in the lectionary recently and speak to giving as an act of our faith. The UCC put out a pamphlet a few years ago called *Are You Ready to Talk About Money In Your Church?* I feel two of the statements reflect the passages above. "Giving to other charitable organization is different from giving to the church because ... giving to the church is a tangible expression of our faith." And "Jesus talked about money a good deal because ... he recognized that how we use money says a lot about what we value."

Saron has not done a stewardship campaign, but that doesn't mean we, as members of this congregation, should not think about our financial giving to the church in an intentional way. We are invited to participate in the mission and ministry of Saron each and every week. Our envelopes have three separate funds to designate our offerings to – the general fund (budgeted items), improvement fund (building and grounds issues), and the benevolent fund (special mission projects). It is this fund, the benevolent fund, that I would like to highlight this month.

Webster's New World Dictionary defines benevolence as, 1. An inclination to do good, kindliness; 2. A kindly, charitable act. It makes sense that the fund that supports mission is called benevolence as it supports doing good. Saron's benevolent fund supports Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM), our SPARE student, the CAMPital Campaign, and any other mission projects that may come up. OCWM has many components and I will be highlighting those things in worship beginning in October – sharing stories of how people's lives have been changed and churches strengthened by our support of OCWM. The benevolent fund is also the pass-through account for the four special offerings of the UCC – One Great Hour of Sharing, Strengthen the Church, Neighbors in Need, and The Christmas Fund.

The 2018 benevolence budget passed by the congregation in January approved a total of \$20,450.00 (\$19,200 for OCWM and \$1,250 for SPARE). This does not mean that more money cannot be given to the benevolence fund. The CAMPital Campaign is listed as getting any leftover money and the Consistory approved money for General Synod which will be held in Milwaukee next year. Currently we are about \$11,000 short for just OCWM and SPARE. The only income to this fund is you, the members of Saron UCC. Saron's Vision Statement says, "We envision Saron Church as an active welcoming community of faith, an embodiment of Christ-like grace and love, which ministers to the community and the world." What better way of ministering to our community and the world then by supporting the benevolent fund.

Each week we are given the opportunity to participate in the mission and ministry of Saron in three ways. All are important, and all need our support. Please prayerfully consider your support, not because the church needs the money, but because "giving to the church is a tangible expression of our faith."



Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering -

The 2018 theme is "Love your Neighbor".

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry(CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, special consideration will be given to projects focusing on serving our immigrant neighbors and communities.

NIN is one of the UCC's five-for-five offerings throughout the year, which Saron was a "five-for-five" church in 2017. This special offering will be accepted until World Communion Sunday, October 7th, 2018. There are offering envelopes in the pews. Please make your check payable to Saron UCC.
